

All trussed up

Members of Ironworkers Local 17 in Cleveland position a pair of 110-foot-long atrium skylight trusses Monday at the Cleveland Museum of Art. The atrium, measuring 100 by 315 feet, will be the centerpiece of the museum's \$350 million expansion and renovation, designed by architect Rafael Viñoly and scheduled for completion in 2013. Fabricated by Schuff Steel Co. of Ottawa, Kan., the trusses are shipped to Comm Steel Corp. in Cleveland for further assembly and then trucked to the museum for installation by Kelley Steel Erectors Inc. of Bedford. So far, 10 of 24 trusses have been installed in pairs, each of which weighs 23 tons. The trusses will be fully installed by September.
